REFLECTIONS: Calming Life's Storms Touching



Jesus She said, "If I but touch his Reflections clothes, I shall be cured." Mark 5:28 Here is an example of one who comes to Jesus with great

faith. It's a fascinating story in that we are given the gift of being able to know her thoughts.

This woman had suffered greatly for many years. She tried everything she could to be cured by doctors. She spent all she had. And then, in this desperate state, the woman turned in faith to Jesus. Perhaps she had had great faith throughout her life; we do not know. What we do know is that in her suffering, she was greatly humbled and was out of options. In this humble condition she did what any saint would do. She held on to the conviction that Jesus was the answer. When all else failed, Jesus would not let her down. Perhaps she didn't know if she would be physically healed, but she did know she had to turn to Jesus nonetheless.

There is a great lesson in this story in that we must have the same depth of trust and the same commitment to turn to Jesus with our life. Even if we have not tried every other option in life, we must all embrace the witness this woman gives. Turning to Jesus with deep certainty and faith means we know that His will is all that matters. It means that we choose Him above all else and in every circumstance of life. It means we do not only turn to Him with our problems, we also turn to Him with our joys and in our blessings. Everything we do

must come from a deep interior conviction that Jesus is the answer to everything in life.

Perhaps that sounds like a bit much. Perhaps we have a habit of turning to Him only when everything else seems to fail us. But it shouldn't be so. We are called to build a daily habit of seeking to "touch His clothes," so to speak. This is a way of saying we must turn our heart, mind, will and soul to Him always.

Reflect, today, on how deep your habit is of reaching out to Jesus. Is He the first one you praise in your blessings? And is He the first one you turn

to in your fears and struggles? Build this interior habit and you will see miracles of grace in your life. Lord, help me to always turn to You in all things. WHEN WILL THE CHURCH REOPEN? The church will reopen as soon as we reach Phase three in the

province's reopening plan. If all goes well with the reopening schedule, then we will be due to open up to the capacity of one hundred people on June 30th 2021. This will be a Wednesday morning so mass will be available to attend that morning at 9:00 am to a first come first served basis to a maximum of 100 people. The weekend of July 3rd and 4th, the masses will resume the same times previous to the lockdown. Mass times will be 4:00pm on Saturday and 9:00 am & 11:00 am on Sunday here at St. Ambrose. Our Lady of Lourdes will reopen on July 4th with the 10:00 am Mass. Masks and social distancing protocols will still be followed.

WHO'S TURN IS IT WHEN THE CHURCH OPENS?

When we return to mass on July 3rd and 4th, we will return to the schedule that was passed out to you in April. Group B is scheduled for this particular weekend and Group A will start on July 10th and 11th. However, we will contact you the previously to confirm your start date.

RESOURCE: AMORIS LAETITIA VEDIO SERIES

On March 19, 2021 the Church celebrated five years since the release of Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia on the beauty and joy

of life in the family. To mark this occasion, the Pope launched the Year "Amoris Laetitia Family," which concludes on June 26, 2022, at the 10th World Meeting of Family in Rome with the Holy Father. In light of this, the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life at the Vatican has produced a resource for everyone to delve deeper into the document. Over the course of ten monthly episodes, Pope Francis will discuss each chapter of Amoris Laetitia, paired with testimonies of different families who will share some aspects of their daily lives. Each video is accompanied by a free downloadable guide to encourage the reading of Amoris Laetitia among families and ecclesial (diocesan, parochial, community) groups.
