REFLECTION: "Sleep is sweet to the laborer,



whether there is little or much to eat; but the abundance of the rich allows them no sleep" (Ecclesiastes 5:11).

This saying from the wisdom of Ecclesiastes informs our contemplation this

week. A rich person can't sleep because he has to constantly guard the abundance that has come his way. The rich man in the parable would build bigger barns in his effort to safeguard his agricultural windfall. The workers sleep soundly. They have completed the heavy work in the field and know that all growth and agricultural bounty comes directly from God. They have a hand in the work of God; not so the rich man.

St. Ambrose once preached a sermon on this parable and suggested that the rich man did not need to build bigger barns to store his grain. The saint suggested that there would have been ample room to store the grain in the mouths of the poor. Very true indeed.

What is our response going to be to the Gospel this week? I support two charities that feed the hungry around the world. My wife and I make a monthly donation to each so that from our bounty we can share with others less fortunate than ourselves. You can do some research and find a way you too can support those who don't have enough. In this way we can all become "rich in what matters to God." - Kevin Saunders, 2019 American Bible Society
