On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This feast is designed to give special recognition to the dominion Christ our Lord has over all aspects of our lives.

Every Sunday when we pray the Creed at Mass we profess our faith in Jesus Christ, affirming that "he will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his Kingdom will have no end."
