REFLECTION: The Way Has Been Prepared...Are You Ready? John said: "I am 'the voice of one crying out in the desert, "Make straight the way of the Lord," 'as Isaiah the prophet said." John the Baptist is alive! Yes, he is alive in Heaven receiving his eternal reward. But he's also alive in another way. He's alive in his ongoing proclamation, calling us to repentance and calling us to prepare the way for the Lord in our lives. His message is just as relevant for us today as it was some 2,000 years ago. At the time he walked the earth, he preached so as to prepare the immediate way for Christ. Make a clear resolution to identify any obstacle to the coming of Christ into your heart and let yourself discover the new life that awaits you this coming year. Lord, You came into this world out of perfect love for me. You came to save me from all sin and You came to deliver me from all evil. Help me to see that which has kept me from You this past year and to surrender it to You. Help me also to have hope and vision for all that awaits and all that You are calling me to. May I heed the words of the Baptist and make the road ahead straight so that I can follow Your perfect will. Jesus, I trust in You.
